Q.1 Reservation/Web-based screening

Q.1-1 When can I make a reservation?

Wednesday, April 1, at 1:00 p.m.

Q.1-2 Can I take a health checkup without a reservation?

No. The checkup is by reservation only. If you do not have a reservation, you cannot be examined. Please complete the web questionnaire and then make a reservation.

Q.1-3 I can't make a reservation for the date I want.

In the latter half of the checkup period, reservations tend to fill up. Please book and take your checkup as early as possible. Slots may change depending on circumstances; cancellations can open up slots—check the reservation status periodically.

Q.1-4 Can I change my reservation?

You can change your reservation after logging in to the reservation web page "Those who have already applied with an e-mail address", and cancel your reservation by clicking "Confirmation/Change of reservation frame (time zone)" on "My Page". If there is a vacancy in the reservation, you can change it even on the day.

Q.1-5 I forgot the password for the reservation page.

You can reset the password from "パスワードを忘れた方 : Forgot password" on the login screen.

Q.1-6 I have made a reservation. I don't know how to return to the reservation page.

Use the "Web Questionnaire / Reservation" button on the Health Checkup page of the Center for Health Sciences and Counseling website, or the URL in your confirmation e-mail. If the e-mail did not arrive, check your spam folder. If your registered e-mail was incorrect, newly register and rebook; in that case, duplicate registration/reservation may occur—contact the Center for Health Sciences and Counseling (Infirmaries) to correct it.

Q.1-7 I don't know my student number. I have not received my student card.

New students will receive a student ID card at the university enrollment ceremony. Please check your student number on your student ID card. If you miss the enrollment ceremony, please obtain your student ID card at the Student Support Section (Ito Campus Center Zone Building 1) for first-year undergraduate students, and at the Student Support Section of each department for other students.

Q.1-8 I tried to enter SSO-KID, but I couldn't enter the Web-based Screening System (tentative).

You need to activate the student SSO-KID, which was given to you at the time of enrollment, and then log in.

Q.1-9 After logging in with SSO-KID, the Web-based Screening System (tentative) does not display the " Web-Based Screening Reservation" page.

① If you have worked as an employee of Kyushu University, you will be asked to use two different SSO-KIDs, one for employees and the other for students. If you log in with the SSO-KID for employees, the Web-based Screening System (Provisional) screen for employees will open. ② After logging in to the Web-based Screening System (tentative), if "Web-Based Screening Reservation" page does not appear for unknown reasons, please contact the Support Section, Student Support Division.

Q.1-10 I am a student at Ito Campus, can I take a checkup at Hospital Campus?

Yes. You may reserve and receive your checkup at any campus venue.

Q.1-11 Do I need to take a Web-based screening?

Yes. Complete it before reception; otherwise you may be declined. It is a required item—without it, your checkup is incomplete and a certificate cannot be issued.

Q.1-12 When are urine test containers distributed?

Urine collection containers are distributed at the same time as student ID cards.

Q.1-13 When should I collect the urine sample?

Collect the first urine of the morning immediately after waking. ([See the instructions for urine collection.](#))

Q.1-14 Can I complete the urine test during menstruation?

Avoid menstruation days if possible. If rescheduling is difficult, do not collect urine during menstruation and inform the staff at the venue on the day.

Q.2 About the day of the checkup

Q.2-1 What should I bring on the day?

Please bring the following items with you.

Student ID card

T-shirt for chest x-ray (plain white or black)

Attendance card (either by presenting a screen shot or a printout of the booking page)

Mask (recommended)

Urine test container containing collected urine (Undergraduate Year-1, Master's Year-1).

Q.2-2 I don't know how to view my attendance card.

Please go to "My Page" on the reservation page and click the "参加証発行 : Issue of Participation Certificate" button.

Q.2-3 The body temperature was over 37°C in the morning.

If 37.5°C or higher, you cannot be examined. Adjust your condition and reschedule.

Q.2-4 I have a cough.

If you have a cough that could infect others, such as a new coronavirus infection or influenza, you cannot be seen; for asthma and other coughs, please contact the head office or the branch office mentioned in the answer to Q.2-8.

Q.2-5 I don't have a thermometer.

Please bring your own thermometer.

Q.2-6 Are gowns for chest X-rays provided at the venue?

No gowns are available for loan. Please bring your own T-shirt.

Q.2-7 What kind of T-shirt should I prepare for a chest X-ray?

Please prepare a plain white or black T-shirt. Avoid illustrations, embroidery, buttons, pockets, etc., as they will affect the image. If it is plain, you can use a running shirt or tank top (no metal hardware or cups).

Q.2-8 Who should I contact if I want to discuss my health condition before taking a checkup?

Please contact a nearby Center for Health Sciences and Counseling.

Q.3 About medical examination certificate

Q.3-1 Can I get a medical examination certificate soon?

Medical examination certificates are scheduled to be issued about 3 to 4 weeks after the checkup. If you want to get it earlier, please take a checkup as on an earlier date as possible.

Please refer to "[Medical Examination Certificate for 2026](#)" for a detailed issuance schedule.

Q.3-2 Where can I get a medical examination certificate?

You may obtain certificates from the certificate machines on each campus or from convenience stores (for a fee). For automatic issuance, you must apply online in advance.

For those who are not automatically issued certificates (students requiring retesting based on chest X-ray results, those with abnormal values in urine retesting, students in the Mass for Innovation Collaborative Graduate School, non-degree students, and students on leave of absence), Center for Health Sciences and Counseling will issue certificates.

Please contact your nearest Campus Life and Health Support Center as soon as possible to request a certificate.

Q.3-3 Can you issue the certificate in English?

Yes, at your nearest Center for Health Sciences and Counseling. Please allow about 1–2 weeks for issuance.

Q.4 Other

Q.4-1 What should I do if I want to talk about things related to taking a checkup?

If you need special assistance (e.g., physical disability, mental disorder, chronic health condition, developmental disorder, gender dysphoria and/or religious issue), please contact in advance [the Support Section, Student Support Division by e-mail](#) one week before your preferred date or earlier.

Q.4-2 What should I do if there are any abnormalities in the checkup findings?

If you possibly need a secondary examination with a school doctor, the Center for Health Sciences and Counseling will contact you at a later date.

Q.4-3 I have not received a checkup.

If you forgot to take a checkup on your scheduled date, rebook another date during the checkup term. However, if the checkup term is over, you will not be able to receive a checkup this year, and you should visit an outside clinic for obtaining a medical examination certificate.
